WINCHESTER CITY COUNCIL MEETING

The Winchester City Council held their monthly meeting January 7, 2026 at City Hall.

Mayor McIntire led those attending the meeting in the Pledge of Allegiance.

The City Council room as standing room only for the first time. Everyone was there for one person. Kyler Thompson, 11-year-old, son of Darrell and Abby Thompson. He was being honored as a hero for saving his siblings life from a devastating house fire on December 14, 2025. The Fire Chief, Bryan Taylor, commended him for know exactly what to do when he heard his sister scream. He carried her outside and started the truck for her to stay warm and then ran back in to get his older brother and family dogs. He then ran barefoot to the neighbors in zero-degree temperatures and snow with no shoes or coat to get help. Mackenzie Evans from the Illinois State Fire Marshall presented him with lifesaving award on behalf of the State Fire Marshall. Everyone is calling him a hero but he was very modest and said he just did what he had to do. Several news sources covered the event such as Ben Cox, The Source, Carmean Ensinger, River County News, Harold Smith, WLDS and Cassie Schone from KHQA.

Wanda Cody, City Treasurer presented bills for approval.

Greg Hillis, Benton Engineering, not present but did advise that looking deeper into the pool pump issue, there is one more payment to Trotter for library one we receive.

Jeanette Wallace, Head Librarian, advised will be receiving the Carnegie grant for \$10,000 this month. It is to celebrate the 250th year of the Carnegie library.

Looking into getting a grant from the Tracy Family Foundation for \$10,000. This will enable the library to hire Kaitlyn Coulter to handle existing kids' programs, summer reading and create other events for kids.

Having a Genealogy program on 02/12/2026 at 6 pm. This will show people how to research family history.

Children's programs are ongoing such as move and groove, story hour and Lego club. Will be having summer reading again this year.

Have the Book Ender book club 1st Wed of every month at 6 pm.

Also have a historical fiction book club every 3rd Thursday at 10 am.

School had a family reading night event at the library and was well attended,

Curious George made an appearance.

Wanda Cody, City Treasurer, will be sitting down with Jeanette to go over finances and will attend the monthly board meeting in February for questions from the board.

There is another grant coming up soon to apply for to benefit the library and will keep eye on that

Steve Doolin, Police Chief, presented monthly report.

Lansaw serviced and checked the tornado siren and recommends new batteries. For installation and batteries will be total of \$799.72.

MOTION: Jack Daniels moved and Terry Gregory seconded to approve batteries for weather siren for \$799.72. Roll call resulted in all yeas. Motion carried.

Wanda Cody, Treasurer, presented monthly financial reports.

Cemetery CD is due to renew 01/14/2026. Rates for 5-month at Petefish and Skiles for 3.75%. UCB has a 6 month at 3.95%. Farmers bank was 7 or 9-month at 3.7%.

Council agreed to go with 6-month at 3.95% at UCB

TIF fund is doing well.

Going to use the \$3617.31 from the civic group parks and recreation group and apply to the supplies for the pickleball court.

John will be checking into LED lighting for the pool area.

Rex McIntire, Mayor, advised that the girls up front are wishing to do away with the counter and have regular desks. The way it is now it is making it very awkward for a lot of computer work, One, of the girls has started to have to go have adjustments due to the way the area is set up now and the other has just had hip surgery. John stated that the guys are able to do the labor and remove the counters and we have a couple nice desks that can be used, Will look into what options there are.

Would like to bid out the sidewalk work for the new convenience store, Peak insurance building and Main St to Rt 106. Can be done as individual bids or all together.

Wanting to get a committee together to help locate a Lincoln statue. Funds received so far are at \$13,659.00.


